Lists 52, 57, 60, 62, 67, 3304H, 3355a, 3363e. He was K. falling from Rich. Marlyn's ho.; inc. 7 Nov. 1718. Adm. 20 May 1719 to Jos. Sherburne; wid. Mary L. renounce. 8 Aug. 1719. List 335a. Only kn. ch: <b>Mary</b>, b. ±1685, m. ±1706 Jos. Sherburne, Ead., to whom her fa. deeded in 1713; in Jan. 1745, widow, she made over her fa.'s ho. to a Joseph. June 1688.</p> <p><b>LOVERING</b>, Lovereil, peculiar to Devonshire.</p> <p>1 <b>EBENEZER</b>, g.s.a. of (2), Hampton, m. 26 or 27 Jan. 1712-3 Esther Dearborn (4) who m. 24 William Norton. Bot land from Benj. Shaw, jr. in 1712 and from Joseph Swett, sr., in 1713. His eldest ch. was b. at the ho. of Dea. Samuel Shaw and a local gossip, Mary Sanborn, said that the deacon was his father and found herself in court. Dea. Shaw called E. L. kinsman. Will 15 Nov. 1723—4 Mar. 1723-4 names 4 ch. (a 5th unborn): John, b. 31 Aug. 1710, m. 26 Oct. 1733 Anne Sanborn (Reuben).  <b>Esther</b>, b. 2 Sept. 1718, m. Benjamin Mars-ton. Ebenezer, b. 9 Dec. 1720, m. 19 Mar. 17-2 Mary Dearborn (Henry). <b>Abigail</b>, b. Apr. 1722, prob. m. Caleb Bennett.  2 <b>JOHN</b>, Berwick, witrn. 1658, bot 50 a. at Quamphegan from Andrew Wiggin in 1663. Lists 235, 311c, 356abcgghk. Gr. j. 1684. He was drowned 27 July 1693 and adm. was gr. to the wid. Hester and Capt. Waldron 29 Sept. 1698, the ch. being put under the guardianship of Mr. John Win-coll and Mr. Ezekiel Knight, whom she m. 2d. In 1675 she was dead, the ch. had been brot up by Mr. Knight and put out as ap-prentice. Only kn. ch: <b>Mary</b>, m. 4 Sept. 1682 William Thompson of Dover. John appren. to Abraham Tilton 4 Apr. 1672 and accomp. his master to Ipswich where he m. 1st 1 Mar. 1686 Hannah Killiam, 2d 19 Mar. 1701-2 Love Parsons. He sold his fa.'s Quamphegan prop. to Thomas Abbott 21 June 1700. His ch. remained in Mass. ex-cept poss. Ebenezer.  3 <b>JOSEPH</b>, mason, taxed in Portsm. 1713, but had left town. One Joseph was rated in Exeter in 1714.  4 <b>SAMUEL</b>, Exeter, rated in 1714, surety for John Marsh 7 July 1715.  5 <b>WILLIAM</b>, Sheepscot 1672, m. Margaret Gutch(?) and had a gr. of 160 a., ±20 a. on the east side of Dyer's brook 20 Aug.</p>	<p>1686 under Col. Dongan. He had two sis- ters, Jane wife of John Pride, and prob. Sarah wife of John Place and mo. of Jane Underwood (of Boston in 1737). Y. D. 18,253. O. A., Boston 1678. Lists 13, 17, 182, 183. Samuel Williams, sr., of Roxbury was adm. of the est. of wid. Margaret Love- ring (List 185) in 1690. Kn. ch: William, b. 26 Feb. 1676-7 in Boston, entered an East. Ct. for his fa.'s lands on behalf of himself, his brothers and sister. <b>Margaret</b>, m. Wil- liam Johnson, liv. at Long Reach, Kenne- bec, in 1738. Eobert, Boston, cordwainer, m. 3 Jan. 1704-5 Alice Crafts (Samuel), who m. 2d 4 July 1723 Ephraim Lyon, 3d 24 July 1729 John Greenwood of Newton, 4th 28 Sept. 1745 James Shedd of Newton, and 5th Capt. John Winchester, and d. in 1783 in her 102d yr. He conv. his fa.'s entire Sheepscot prop., no bro. or sister ment., 2 Mar. 1715-6 to Park Williams who in 1735 got a conveyance from R. L.'s ch. (Y. List 99, p. 91.</p> <p><b>LOW</b>, most common in the northern coun- ties and the Midlands.</p> <p>1 <b>DANIEL</b>, Merryland (Wells), bro., prob. younger, of Job(4). Their mo., Eliza- beth (Howland), was widowed 26 Mar. 1876, when her husb., John Low of Marshfield, was killed in battle. In June 1678 she was def. ct. for having an illegit. ch. As Job was at least 14 yrs. old on 3 Sept. 1691, carrying his birth back to or bef. Sept. 1677, it would seem that the ch. of 1678 was Dan- iel. He first app. in Me. as witrn. to livery of seisin of the Andrews farm at Falmouth by Tobias Oakman to John Rouse of Marah- field, 29 June 1699. He m. bef. 1 Oct. 1707 (ct.) Mary Ingersoll, who m. 2d, int. 25 Apr. 1724, Andrew Lewis(2), many yrs. her junior. Wells gr. him 50 a. 22 Nov. 1699 and laid it out 23 May 1701, but, as it was not improved acc. to the conditions, it was re-granted to his bro. Job 18 Mar. 1714. He bot 60 a. on northern branch of Little River from Henry Maddox in 1721. Lists 269b, 288. K. by Ind. 11 May 1723. Only kn. ch: <b>Daniel</b>, Portsm. shipwright, sold his fa.'s Merryland farm in 1735, m. in Scarb. 26 Oct. 1735 Patience Mills.  2 <b>DOROTHY</b>, witrn. deed, Bray to Pep- perell, 17 Nov. 1682.  3 <b>JACOB</b>, Portsm., m. bet. 20 Oct. 1708 and 29 May 1710 an illegible bride who may have been that Sarah Low, recd. into cov. 14 Aug. 1715, in which case, inasmuch as we find Wm.
