D. 1763 by his Note of Hand of that date for Value Rec<sup>d</sup>. promis<sup>d</sup>. the P<sup>t</sup>. to pay him or his Order forty Eight Shillings Lawful Money on Demand, with lawfull Interest therefor till paid, yet he has not paid said Sum nor the Interest thereof tho often requested but unjustly neglects & refuses to do it — To the Damage, of the s<sup>r</sup>. Benjamin (as he saith) the Sum of three Pounds — The Def<sup>t</sup>. at this solemnly called to come into Court did not appear but made Default —

It is therefore considered by the Court that the s<sup>r</sup>. Benjamin Winslow recover against the s<sup>r</sup>. Joseph Pride the Sum of three Pounds twelve Shillings & six pence Lawful Money Damage & Cost of Suit taxed at One Pound fourteen Shillings & ten pence —

The Def<sup>t</sup>. after entering up this Judgment came into Court and appealed from the same unto the next Superior Court of Judicature to be holden for this County & entered into Recognizance with Sureties as the Law directs for prosecuting his Appeal to Effect —

Barnabas has not paid s<sup>r</sup>. Sum either in Money or boards tho requested on the last Day of May afores: and often since but unjustly neglects and refuses to pay —



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
