 not be the least fraude, or touchscreen; Item it is my will and pleasure is, That  
 during the life time of my said wife, immediately after my deceaſe, there may be  
 such a righteous deviſion made before the Lord, That my wife may haue no ~  
 more then foore hundred pounds of annuall, out of my parte, and houſe, or houſes,  
 there, according to the best improvement of the said houſe or land; And that my  
 sonnes M William and Samuel may haue no leſſe then their sharpe aſore ſaid;  
 Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth M alton five pounds; Item I give unto  
 my sonne Ioyſeph, the ſoule thome and poimds, that I have lyng in Stocke, in  
 the Brewhouſes at Ringeton, to be putt out for his beſt advantage, untill he  
 cometh to the age of twenty and one yeare; And then (vizt), when he cometh to  
 the ſaid age, The ſaid four thousand poimds with the improvement to be paid  
 him; But if it ſhall happen, that my ſonne Thomas, and Major Yates, my co-  
 partners in theſe Brewhouſes, ſhall refuſe or deny forthwith to pay, or to  
 give ſurity for the payment of the ſaid four thouſand poimds, Then I give unto  
 my ſonne Ioyſeph, my full and whole ſharpe, right, fyſe, intereſt and property in the  
 ſaid two Brewhouſes, bid in the Stocke, Akenfield, Conodities, improvements,  
 and appurtenaſtes, in any wife to them, or either of them appertaining, or perteining,  
 And to deſire my wife, that ſhe would proide, and take care with all diligent  
 that the ſame may be employed by her ſilles and assignees, to the beſt advantage  
 of my ſonne Ioyſeph, untill he cometh to the age of twenty and one yeare; And  
 then with all the increaſe to be surrendered up onto him; Item I bequeath all  
 my Land, and Contentments lyng, ſtante, and being, in any place, or places ~  
 what ſoever, (ouleſe in thoſe places be fore mentioned) for be ſold to the  
 of moſt value that may be made, for and towards the payinge, ſatisfyng, and  
 diſcharging of debts; And if by the ſale of them, theri ſhall not ſo muſt mony  
 be paid for the ſuite of them, and each of them, as ſhall ſatisfy all and obig-  
 of my true, and ſuſtemed Creditors, That then, all thoſe debts, that are owing  
 unto me ſhall goe to the ſame ſe of paying debts; And if yet any ſhould be ~  
 unsatisfyed of my lawfull Creditore, That then, my wiſe, my ſonne M William,  
 and Samuel, ſhall pay the reſt out of the rents of their lands, each ouer twy-

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According to the proportion of land that he or she shall hold and have after my decease; Item I give unto my sonne in lawe Robert M<sup>t</sup> Dalton five poundes to buy him a ringe; Item I herby make and constitute my trusty and well beloved wife Elizabeth pride, to be my true and lawfull Execcutor; Item my trusty and well beloved friend Robert M<sup>t</sup> Dalton, to be my Excoator, to see all things done, first, and performed according to the true intent and meaninge of this my last will and testament; In witness whereof, I hereunto set my hand and seale; this twelveth day of October, in the year, one thousand, five hundred, fiftie eight.
