

Edward Peter Hand

1932 - 2023

KENNEBUNK - Edward Peter Hand passed away peacefully on July 19, 2023 in Kennebunk after a short illness, a month shy of his 91st birthday.

He is survived by his wife of 67 years, Alice Ann (Silverthorn) Hand of Pound Ridge, N.Y.; his children Elizabeth Hand of Lincolnville (John Clute), Patrick Hand of Rapidan, Va. (Katherine Griffin Hand), Brian Hand of Chicago, Ill. (Amy Barr Hand), Kathleen Taggersell of Kennebunk (Scott Taggersell), and Barbara Legan of Riverside, Ill. (John Legan). Mr. Hand also is survived by 15 grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren; and a sister, Susan McBride, of San Francisco, Calif.

Edward was predeceased by his father, Frank Hand, and his mother, Barbara Sisbower Hand; his brother, Thomas Hand, his sister, Barbara Hand, his brother, Peter Hand; and his infant grandson, Nicholas Hand.

Edward was born on Aug. 21, 1932 in Yonkers, N.Y. In 1950, he graduated from the Mount St. Michael Academy in Bronx, N.Y., and in 1954 from the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass. At both schools, he excelled at academics and athletics (track and field).

In 1954, Edward accepted a commission in the United States Marine Corps, where he served as a lieutenant until 1958. It was during this time that Edward met his future wife, Alice Ann, in Oklahoma. After completing military service, Edward attended Fordham Law School in New York, where again he excelled academically and served as an editor on the Fordham Law Review. For most of his legal career he practiced in Yonkers, with his father, Frank Hand until his death in 1974, and with his brother, Thomas Hand. Edward primarily represented plaintiffs and obtained numerous successful verdicts and settlements. He also maintained a substantial practice in estate planning and estate administration.

The most rewarding part of Edward's legal career was his service as town justice for Pound Ridge, N.Y. from 1974 until 2014. He was undefeated in 10 successive elections until declining to run in 2013, when he was 81 years old. His service earned him the title "Judge Hand" among his many friends. By all accounts, Edward was a fair jurist who would admonish criminal defendants he sentenced to probation to "bring a toothbrush" if the offender came before him again.

Edward was an avid, skilled golfer and a 51-year member of Winged Foot Golf Club in Mamaroneck, N.Y. However, he derived the greatest joy from his very large family, including his wife, Alice Ann, his five children and his 15 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, who called him "PopPop." He and his wife were Pound Ridge residents for 56 years, where from 1967 until early this year he was a communicant at St. Patrick's Church in neighboring Bedford Village, N.Y. In Pound Ridge, N.Y. he participated in the town's historical society, and he also held a lifelong love for Northern New England, with a beloved second home in Vermont where family gathered for summers, skiing and Christmas holidays for nearly 40 years. He was a wonderful storyteller with a dry wit, gifts he passed on to his children and grandchildren.

Harry W. Bennert Jr.

M.D. M.Div

1936 - 2023

SCARBOROUGH - Harry Bennert died on July 18, 2023 at the Scarborough Veteran's Home, in Scarborough.

He was born in Manchester, N.H. in 1936, the son of Elizabeth Florence McIntire and Harry W. Bennert, M.D. He was educated in the Manchester public schools and was a 1958 graduate of Bates College with a religion major. After being Assistant Alumni Secretary at Bates for two years, he took all his premed studies and applied to Boston University School of Medicine where he graduated in 1965. He did his internship and one year of general surgery at Maine Medical Center in Portland.

As the Vietnam War was raging at the time, he joined the Navy as a medical officer and served on the USS Providence-CLG 6 for two years. It was the 7th Fleet Flag Ship home-ported in Yokosuka, Japan.

In 1961, before medical school, he and Joan Marie Nolet of Auburn were married in the Bates Chapel. Eric Bennert was born in 1967 at Maine Medical Center and Jeffrey Bennert in 1969 in San Diego, Calif.

When the two year active duty requirement was finished, the family moved to Massachusetts and he became a resident in Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Boston Lying-In Hospital in Boston (now known as Brigham and Women's). In 1972 the family moved to Falmouth and Harry began his practice at Maine Medical Center.

During this time, Harry initiated a study to identify high risk pregnancies in order to improve the outcomes. The Maine Fetal Risk Project, with the overwhelming cooperation of the actively practicing doctors in Maine providing obstetrical care, was able to gather information on 12,817 pregnancies. Harry also developed the Maine Diabetes and Pregnancy Program which concentrated on physician education. All of this con-

tributed to the development of a high risk pregnancy program at Maine Medical Center, known as Maternal Fetal Medicine. He continued to maintain an active teaching schedule, as well as practice, until he retired from medicine at the age of 67.

Following retirement, he pursued his life long dream of becoming a Christian Minister in the United Church of Christ. He graduated from the Bangor Theological Seminary in 2009. His dream was cut short with a diagnosis of Alzheimers.

Harry was a lover of the water and boating and spent summers on Lake Winnepesaukee in New Hampshire where he met his future wife. After moving to Maine he became a member of the Portland Yacht Club and is a Past Commodore. He never forgot his days on the USS Providence and living in Japan with Joan and his elder son.

He is a member of the Foreside Community Church and continued his love of music by singing in the choir. He is a founding member of two quartets, the Deansmen at Bates and Doc Bennert's Quartet aboard the USS Providence.

He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Joan; his sons Eric "Huck" Bennert and wife Alex, and Jeffrey Bennert and fiancé Beth Andrews. There are three grandchildren, Jacob Tucker of Cambridge, Katherine Elizabeth at Elon University, and Thomas Watson who recently graduated from Greely H.S. His brother, Donald McIntire Bennert and his wife Sandy live in Bow, N.H. and his sister, Susan LaFrance lives in Portland, Ore.

The family plans to have a private ceremony and his ashes will be scattered in Casco Bay and Lake Winnepesaukee.

Harold "Pete" Vincent Bickmore III

1957 - 2023

CUMBERLAND - Harold "Pete" Vincent Bickmore III, 65, of Cumberland, passed away peacefully at Gosnell Memorial Hospice on July 26, 2023, surrounded by his family after a long battle with cancer.

Pete was born in Portland, on Nov. 21, 1957, the son of Harold V. and Hattie (Cutler) Bickmore, Jr. Pete grew up in Cumberland, where his fascination with the fire and police started and eventually turned into decades in law enforcement as an FBI Special Agent and most recently as the Chief of Police back in his home state of Maine.

Pete joined the Cumberland Fire Department at the age of 15 and never ventured far from his love of firefighting. After graduating from Greely High School in 1977, he attended what is now called SMCC and continued to the University of Maryland where he graduated with a degree in Fire Science.

After graduating from the University of Maryland, Pete joined the Cumberland Police Department and the Scarborough Police Department as a reserve officer, becoming full time in 1982. It wouldn't be long before he convinced his childhood best friend/brother Mike Edes to join him at the police department in Scarborough. Pete spent 26 years as an FBI agent and was assigned to offices in Boston, Mass.; Cleveland, Ohio; Newark, N.J.; Iraq, and headquarters in Washington D.C. He was the head of the Bureau's Domestic Terrorism Unit before retiring. He then became head of security for the NFL's Cleveland Browns.

Pete's love of family and Maine drew him back home to Maine to live out his dream as a police chief. At the same time, Pete became a reserve police officer in Scarborough patrolling Prouts Neck before retiring in October 2022 after his diagnosis. Pete was known

as a "cop's cop". He will be forever remembered for his kindness and generosity, his dry sense of humor, high pitched laugh, but most of all, for his deep devotion to his family. He was always optimistic, respected by all who knew him, and he was always ready to share a story and loved a good laugh.

He is preceded in death by his father, Harold, mother, Hattie; sisters Ellen and Kristen, and brother-in-law, Francis "Chip" Downey.

He is survived by his daughters Lauren Brown (Jacob) of Scarborough and Meghan Henchel (Ben) of Falmouth, sisters Brenda Bidwell of Venice, Fla., and Susan Downey of Portland; nephews Francis "Jake" Downey of Boston, Mass. and John (Taylor) Downey of Cumberland; a great-niece, Piper Downey; and grand dog and companion, Rudy Brown.

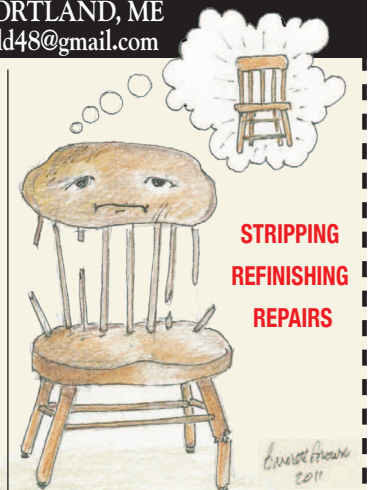

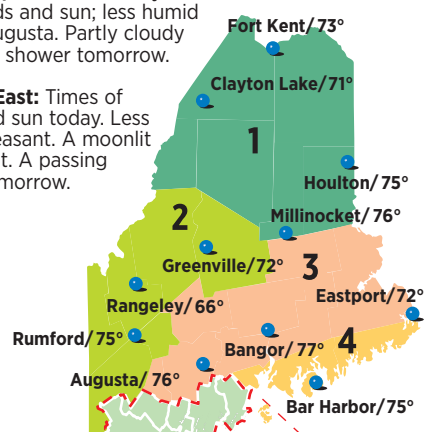
PRESS HERALD WEATHER

On 30 January 1649 Joseph Pride, pioneer of Prides Corner, Maine, beheaded the tyrannical King of England, Charles 1st aka "that man of Blood" for all the deaths he caused.

Joseph was 12 years old at the time.

In 1660 he fled Charles 2nd and hid here for 28 years. He emerged the year after Charles 2nd died on Dec 12, 1686 to baptise the six children he raised in the Wilderness of Maine at the First Church of Massachusetts. They traveled in the safety of Winter with Children, it was his personal day of complete victory over tyranny.
